MEMORANDUM FOR ALL INSPECTORS GENERAL

SUBJECT: Mobile-Training-Team (MTT) Opportunities from the U.S. Army Inspector General School

1. The staff and faculty of the U.S. Army Inspector General School (TIGS) represent a wealth of IG knowledge and experience that all Army IG organizations may leverage for additional on-site training on specific topics. The school's Academic Program includes an MTT program designed to provide outreach as necessary, but only as long as the MTT falls within the three calendar windows outlined below. I encourage all IG organizations to consider requesting additional training opportunities from TIGS as a way to improve your IG organization's knowledge, skills, and overall mission effectiveness.

2. In most cases, TIGS will be able to support mobile-training requests as long as the requestor provides the school with sufficient notice (generally six weeks) and if the request falls within one of the three one-week windows set aside for MTTs each fiscal year as outlined below:

- a. January (normally the second week of the month)
- b. April (normally the second week of the month)
- c. August (normally the third week of the month)

The TIGS Web site (http://tigs-online.ignet.army.mil/tigu_online/index.htm) will have the precise availability dates for these one-week MTT windows for each fiscal year.

3. TIGS will develop and tailor a training package to meet the requestor's needs. Normally, a mobile-training visit will last no longer than three days due to the constraints and requirements of ongoing resident IG training at Fort Belvoir. Examples of the types of training a TIGS MTT can provide are as follows:

- a. Acting IG Training
- b. IG Inspections and Organizational Inspection Program (OIP) Training
- c. Investigations Training
- d. Assistance and IGARS Training

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4. Requests for MTTs must include the following information:

- a. Requested training dates
- b. Type of training requested
- c. Number of attendees
- d. Location of the training
- e. Justification for the training request

5. Submit all MTT requests to the TIGS Dean of Academics, Mr. Stephen M. Rusiecki, via email at Stephen.rusiecki@us.army.mil or by phone at commercial (703) 805-3918 / DSN 655-3918.

6. The Department of the Army Inspector General Agency and TIGS stand ready to assist all Army IGs whenever necessary. As we move into a period of fiscal austerity and transition to a postwar Army, don't hesitate to use the resources available to you to improve your effectiveness as an IG.
